



Address Confidentiality Program

We heard you are interested in applying to the Address Confidentiality Program! We are excited to have you apply and we want you to be prepared to have all supportive documents with you when you meet with your Application Assistant.

- ✓ Have your ID with you.
Your Application Assistant will need to see your ID. This is to check to make sure your information on the application is accurate. It is also to make sure the address that you want to be protected is not on your ID. You do not have to include a copy of your ID with your application, but you do need to show it to your Application Assistant.
- ✓ If you are applying on behalf of another person as a legal guardian, please provide documentation of guardianship (such as if you are a legal guardian of an adult).
- ✓ Know what evidence you will provide and have a copy of it to provide with your application. If you are applying as a provider of services outlined in the law (including providing direct victim services and reproductive healthcare), you will likely be providing a notarized affidavit with your application (the affidavit must include that you are either a victim of a covered offense or a covered employee, and that you fear for your safety). Other forms of evidence are:
 - Law enforcement agency or other District agency records or files;
 - An order of a tribunal (court);
 - Documentation from a domestic violence program or facility including a shelter or safe house;
 - Documentation from a sexual assault program or facility;
 - Documentation from a human trafficking program or facility, including a shelter or safe house;
 - Documentation from a program or facility providing services for victims of stalking;
 - Documentation from a medical professional where you have received assistance in dealing with the covered offense.
- ✓ If you have any questions, JUST ASK! Your Application Assistant can help you determine what paperwork to attach to your application.
